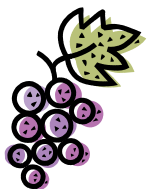
RASPBERRIES BLACKBERRIES

These plants are one-year old, in 1 gallon containers and are well adapted to piedmont growing conditions.



BLUEBERRIES MUSCADINES

These plants are two-years old, in 1 gallon containers and are well adapted to piedmont growing conditions.



RASPBERRIES: \$9 each, \$8 each if five or more are ordered.

NOVA - Early ripening; medium to large berries; good disease resistant; heat tolerate; good flavor and production.

BLUEBERRIES: \$9 each, \$8 each if five or more are ordered.

At least two varieties must be planted to ensure cross-pollination.

BRIGHTWELL - Ripens mid-season and over a long period; large fruit, excellent quality; very productive; growth is vigorous and upright.

PREMIER - Early to mid-season, large fruit. Excellent flavor, light blue in color and good quality. Plants are upright with good foliage. Highly productive.

TIFBLUE - Ripens mid-season; growth is vigorous and upright; excellent for home use.

BLACKBERRIES: \$9 each, \$8 each if five or more are ordered.

OUACHITA - Fruit is sweet, firm and attractive; thornless variety.

TRIPLE CROWN - Fruit is large and sweet; thornless, ripens later than most varieties with very good yields.

MUSCADINES: \$9 each, \$8 each if five or more are ordered.

COWART - The large black fruit is in large clusters and have a very good flavor and fruit quality. This variety is good for eating, making juice, jelly and wine. The vines are self-pollinating, disease resistant, vigorous and productive. Ripens early-mid season.

TRIUMPH: This fruit is good for eating and making wine. The fruit are large, thin skinned and greenish-bronze, with a high sugar content. Triumph's vines are very winter hardy, productive, self pollinating and excellent pollinators for other female varieties. Ripens early-mid season.
